American Heritage Month.

At tonight's liturgy we celebrate the November 3rd Feast of St. Martin de
Porres and the start of National Black Catholic History Month. Whoever
you may be, or wherever you find yourself on the journey, know that here
at St. Matthias, All Are Welcome.

- Also along the lines of justice, St. Matthias is seeking to restart the Social Justice Ministry. This ministry existed years ago and the Parish Pastoral Council is hoping to revive it with your help. - This coming week is National Vocation Awareness week. Also, this week is the last opportunity to register for the November 13th Vocations Ministry Morning of Reflection from 8:30 am to 1:30 pm. 




Glory to God...



PRAYER OF THE FAITHFUL


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Our response will be: "In Your name, O God, we pray."
