Welcome to all who are here today on this 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Whoever you are, or wherever you find yourself on the journey, know that here at St. Matthias, All Are Welcome.

- This weekend we celebrate a significant milestone in the history of our parish - the 60th Anniversary of our founding as the Parish Community of St. Matthias. Bishop James Checchio is presiding at the 12 noon Mass with priests and deacons who served us and/or continue to serve us. All are welcome!
