GOOD MORNING and Happy Easter!!!

We welcome all of you today to celebrate the Profound JOY of EASTER. We invite you to enter into the sacredness of this liturgy, whomever you may be, or wherever you find yourself on the journey. Know that here at St. Matthias, ALL ARE WELCOME!

- Communion distribution for the Mass today will be at the end of the liturgy, just after the final blessing. We ask that you follow the safety guidelines of the Diocese to keep your mask on in the procession line except for when you receive. As you approach the minister, receive the host in your hand and then turn from the minister to lower your mask. Once you have received the host, please immediately replace your mask. If you require communion on the tongue, please wait until everyone else has received and then approach the priest's communion line. Everyone today will exit through the side doors near the altar.
- Finally, if you are in 6th to 12th grade, this message is for you. The St. Matthias youth ministry group, SMYLE, invites you to stop by the Cry Room near the church entrance after all Masses today and next weekend to pick up a bag of Legos, one per person, for the ZOOM SMYLE event next Sunday, April 11th at 6:30 pm when we connect with each other through the connection of Legos.
